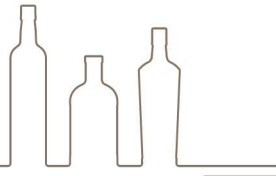


CONSUMER SAFETY GUIDELINES FOR THE USE OF GLASS CONTAINERS

1. Unless otherwise stated, all containers manufactured by Allied Glass are single trip and not intended to be refillable.
2. Glass containers should only be used for their intended purpose, not for any other contents.
3. Always remember that carbonated drinks are under pressure, so the bottle should always be handled with extra care.
4. Take care in opening carbonated drinks bottles with crown closures. They should be opened slowly, allowing the gas to escape gently and the correct proprietary crown opener (not the edge of a desk or table) should be used. If the bottle has a screw cap, this should turn and open with hand pressure only. Do not use a door jamb, pliers or similar unorthodox methods.
5. If a bottle of carbonated drink is dropped, do not immediately stoop down to pick it up. Cover it with a cloth and then pick it up with care and remove to a safe place for examination or disposal.
6. Only buy bottles which are not cracked or chipped. Do not let children carry carbonated drinks bottles, (particularly heavy bottles).
7. Always put bottles down carefully and avoid knocking them over.
8. Bottles should not be placed on hot surfaces and full bottles should not be washed under a hot tap.
9. Soft drinks are best when they are cold. Store them in a cool place away from excessive heat and do not leave them in the sun.
10. When carrying bottles do not let them bang together in a shopping basket or in the back of a car.
11. If the neck of a bottle is damaged as the cap is removed, the contents should be disposed of carefully.

12. Do not use a knife or other similar sharp object to remove tamper evident sleeving on glass containers.
13. Do not use a knife or similar sharp object to remove residue from the inside of a glass container.
14. Never wash a glass container with boiling water or subject the glass container to sudden temperature changes exceeding 42 degrees Celsius.
15. Always use glass containers for their intended purposes, i.e. do not place carbonated beverages into a glass container which is not intended for this use.
